





Home Funerals

- The use of a Funeral Home is NOT Required
- Families may keep the Body at Home for as long as they wish
- A Funeral Service may be engaged to help with Preparation and Final Transportation of the Body





Emotional Benefits

Pre-Arrangements

- Officially called "Pre-Need"
- Requires a License from the state of Residence
- Locks in the Price
- Legally binding
- Can be used for Medicaid "Spend-down"
- Can alleviate angst from spouse and children
